Microbiology, dealing with the study of micro-organisms, is playing a very important role in enhancing employment opportunities, trade, economics and quality of human life. Keeping in view the potential of generating various skilled jobs, the college has started Microbiology as an elective subject at B.Sc. level. This course is very helpful in food and diary industry, pharmaceutical industry, organic chemicals industry, research avenues in agricultural microbiology, medicinal microbiology, environmental microbiology and bioremediation.

Job Potential

Bioinformatics is the product of interaction between Biology and Technology. Bioinformatics professionals have career prospects in Bio-tech, Pharma, IT sectors as research scientist, Bioinformatics programmer, project Manager and Database Developer. In addition to companies Bioinformatics Professionals also have job openings in academia, institutes and hospitals, etc.

Eligibility

Applicants seeking admission to these courses should have passed class XII (Medical Group) examination of CBSE/PSEB or any other equivalent examination recognized by the Punjab University. The candidate should have obtained at least 40% marks in aggregate at this level. However, admission will be on the basis of merit as per general rules of admission.

1. **Subjects filled by the students at the time of admission are provisional.**
2. **Change of subject will be allowed only once subject to the availability of seats in the subject to be taken up.**
3. **With regard to Functional English, Functional Hindi, Science, Commerce and other subjects with practicals, the students cannot appear privately so they must ensure that they have 75% attendance in theory as well as practicals and their academic conditions are cleared in the House Tests.**
4. **A student cannot opt for more than two subjects having practicals.**
5. **No student shall opt for Mathematics as an elective subject unless she had taken up this subject in the previous examination.**
6. **As per new guidelines of P.U., Chandigarh the admission of students in Physical Education shall be finalized after conducting Physical Fitness Test. The subject will not be offered to physically challenged students. Trials for offering the subject will be held from 5.7.2010 to 8.7.2010 at 10:00 a.m. in the college grounds.**

CANCELLATION OF SEATS/ ADMISSION

Admission of all such students who fail to attend at least 33% of the total lectures delivered and practical held in all the papers during the first 10 days from the start of teaching work in the course concerned shall be cancelled by the Principal of the college on the recommendation of H.O.D of Physical education / Incharge B.P.Ed course after following the procedure given below:

1. By the 12th day after the start of classes for a particular course, the names of those students who fail to attend at least 33% of the total lectures / practicals shall be put upon the Department Notice Board. Within 4 days of the date of such notice, a student who is short of attendance may give in writing the reasons for her absence from the classes.
2. If a student does not submit an application in writing within the prescribed time as stated above, or the reasons given by the student in her application are not found to be sufficient and justified in the opinion of the office of the Principal / HOD physical Education, her admission shall be cancelled.
3. All the seats thus falling vacant shall be filled from the waiting list or through subsequent counselling before the last date fixed for admission by the college / university.

When the admission of the students is cancelled as stated above, the list of the candidate (s) next in the waiting list will be put up on the Departmental notice board and admissions made accordingly.

Note: it is obligatory on the part of the student to

keep in touch with the Department for the possibility of seats falling vacant.

Reservation Policy

A candidate applying in a reserved category shall carefully indicate her claim for only one category in the admission form. In case the candidate wrongly indicates claim for more than one reserved category, the one claimed in the first instance shall be considered. No change of category will be entertained / permitted in the application form or otherwise at later stage.

a) **UT Pool:**- 60% seats of the total sanctioned intake will be filled up from amongst the students who have passed their qualifying examination from institutions recognized by the Chandigarh Administration and situated in the U.T. of Chandigarh as a regular student of said College / school subject to the condition that such students must have studied for two years at Chandigarh and have passed one lower qualifying examination from these colleges/ Schools. These seats will be termed as 'UT Pool'.

b). **General Pool:**- 40% of the total sanctioned seats will be filled up from amongst the students who passed their qualifying examination from Institutions other than those located in the Union Territory of Chandigarh or otherwise. These seats will be termed as General Pool.

If the requisite number of students of SC category in the UT pool is not available, the seats will be made open to those students belonging to general category of the said pool. In the general pool if the requisite number of students belonging to SC/ST categories is not available, the reservation will be interchangeable amongst the students of these categories. However, if seats still remain unfilled these will be made open to the students of the general category of the said pool.

Ex-Servicemen, Dependents of Defence / Para Military Personnel etc.

5% of seats in each pool would be filled in from the following categories of students in order of preference.

a). Children/Spouse of the Defence personnel who are awardees of gallantry decorations of Paramvir / Mahavir / Vir Chakra in person or Posthumously.

Or

Children/Spouse of the Defence personnel and para military Personnel like CRPF, BSF, etc. who died while in service and were killed or were totally incapacitated in action while in service and were wholly dependent on them.

b) Children/Spouse of the Defence personnel

and Para- military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc. who died while in service and were wholly dependent on them.

- c) Children/Spouse of the Defence personnel and Para military personnel like CRPF, BSF etc. who were incapacitated while in service and were wholly dependent on them.
- d) Children / Widows of Defence persons killed or disabled to the extent of 50% or more in actions, wards of gallantry awardees, Ex-service man and children of serving Defence personnel/ Ex-serviceman.
- e) Children/Spouse of the Defence personnel and Para-military personnel like CRPF,BSF etc. who are wholly dependent on them.

Note:

- ☛ The applicants seeking admission under category (a) are required to submit the photocopy of citation for gallantry award failing which they will not be considered for this category.
- ☛ The applicants seeking admission under category (b) and (c) are required to submit the certificate from the respective headquarters regarding death or total incapacitation while in service.
- ☛ The applicants seeking admission to category (d) are required to submit discharge certificate from service and certificate of dependence from the Director Zila Sainik Borad.

The applicants claiming admission under category (e) are required to submit the certificate of dependence from the unit in which parents / spouse is serving.

Reservation for other Categories:

There will be no reservation for categories such as:-

1. Backward Class
2. Teacher's Children, self and spouses
3. Widows/Divorced/Deserted Women
4. Border belt / Backward area.
5. Children of innocent civilians killed/ sustained 100% disability by terrorist/ security forces acting in aid of civil powers. Or children of victims of November, 1984 riots. Or children of any deserters killed / 100% physically disabled or children of external / internal migrants. Or physically handicapped/ incapacitated/ mentally challenged.
6. Children / Widows of Punjab Police Personnel killed/ disabled in action.

Rules Pertaining to Academics

1. Eligibility to Appear in the University Examination Attendance Requirement

College Library

We have a Readers' Club to encourage reading habit and develop analytical skills among the students.

Tutorial Groups

- (i) Each student will be assigned to a tutor who will look after her welfare and studies.
- (ii) The tutor will maintain a record of the student's conduct, health, attendance and progress in studies as well as her participation in co-curricular activities.
- (iii) The tutor will lay stress on moral education.
- (iv) Tutorial group meetings will be held on the last Saturday of every month.

Leave Rules

- (i) Student should apply for leave on the leave application form available in the college office.
- (ii) Prior sanction for leave must be taken. In case of sickness or an emergency, the leave application must be submitted within a week.
- (iii) Application for sick leave for more than five days will have to be supported by a Medical Certificate from a Government Dispensary/ Hospital.

- (iv) Absence fine without leave is Re.1/- per period and Rs.4/- for the whole day.

College Uniform

The students are required to wear white uniform on the following occasions:

Dates for sports Scholarships will be notified as and when the Sports Department, Chandigarh Administration, SAI, Netaji Subhash National Institute of Sports, Patiala inform the College.

College Timings and Presence in the College

1. The college starts at 8:40 am.
2. Students must remain in the college till 12:30 pm even if they finish their classes before that time.
3. No visitors are allowed to see the students during college working hours.
4. In case of emergency, only the lecturers authorized by the Principal will sign the application for gate leave.

COLLEGE HOSTEL

Hostel Admission Guidelines

The college hostel has as many as 265 seats. In addition to these seats the college offers an arrangement of 33 students in Govt. Hostel, Sector—24 Chandigarh. **'ON THE SPOT ADMISSION' DOES NOT APPLY TO CANDIDATES WHO SEEK HOSTEL ADMISSION ALSO.'**

The candidates have to apply in advance as per the instruction given below.

- 1) Hostel admission for all streams shall be strictly on merit basis
- 2) **Forms complete in all respects for hostel admission to all the streams are to be submitted by 25.6.2010. Incomplete forms will be rejected.**
- 3) **No forms will be accepted on the day of admission.**
- 4) **A candidate seeking admission to the hostel should apply for hostel seat on prescribed form along with Admission Form of the college.**
- 5) Irrespective of the college seats, the hostel seats are limited. Therefore admission to the college does not ensure the right of the candidate to the hostel seat.
- 6) Admission to Hostel will be as per rules and regulations issued by Chandigarh administration and will be decided by Hostel Admission Committee.
- 7) Hostel seat is allotted directly on merit and for one academic year. The Principal reserves the right to cancel the seat in case of any complaint/default even in the case of old students.
- 8) Students seeking admission to the hostel are expected to read all the rules and regulations printed on the back of the hostel admission form and in the prospectus. Rules and regulations notified from time to time will be binding on resident students.
- 9) **It is mandatory for the parents and local guardians to accompany their wards at the time of admission to the hostel.**
- 10) Old resident students should apply afresh for admission. Their merit and conduct in the hostel in the previous session will be taken into consideration. **For old residents of the hostel, it is notified that admission to the hostel is not a matter of right. Students having compartment/ third division in the previous class will not be allowed hostel seat in the next session.**
- 11) Interview for hostel admission before the admission committee will be held after the college admission on the notified dates for admission in the college. Students are expected to maintain a decent dress code in the hostel and college premises.
- 12) If the candidate fails to report on the day of admission due to any reason, the candidate loses her claim of position on the merit and her case will be considered after entire admission schedule of the college is over and the principal grants permission for the same.
- 13) At the time of admission, parents are advised to inform the hostel authorities of any chronic ailment from which the student may be suffering, so that they are better equipped and prepared to handle such emergencies. In case this fact is concealed, the student's seat will be cancelled the moment it is so discovered.
- 14) Strict action will be taken against the students found indulging in any sort of ragging. She may even be expelled from the hostel as well as from the college.
- 15) Allotment of rooms in the hostel will be strictly according to the rules framed by the college.

General Rules

- 1) **A resident is required to attend a minimum of 50% of lectures delivered per month and 75% of the total lectures delivered failing which she will have to vacate her hostel seat.**
- 2) Students who fail to obtain 25% marks in

aggregate in house examination or have lecture shortage will forfeit their hostel seat.

- 3) **Possession and consumption of any kind of intoxicants in the hostel shall entail expulsion from the hostel.**
- 4) All the residents are required to take their meals in the hostel mess. Minimum charges of 40 meals per month will be charged from each resident.
- 5) No resident will pass on the key of her room to another resident or to an outsider.
- 6) Internal locks / latch locks are not permitted to be installed in the hostel room.
- 7) In case a resident absents herself from classes in the college for seven days continuously without prior permission, she will be asked to vacate the hostel. If a resident student's name is struck off the college rolls for any reason, she will have to vacate the hostel seat.
- 8) No student will be allowed to stay in the college hostel during Autumn and Winter Break and Summer Vacations (after University Examinations).
- 9) Hostel rooms and premises must be kept neat and tidy.
- 10) Parents will countersign the attendance, house tests results, record of outings of their wards regularly.
- 11) Habitual defiance of hostel rules will render a resident student liable to disciplinary action, a special fine and even expulsion from the college.
- 12) Resident students are not allowed to take part in any kind of protest or strikes.
- 13) Parents of defaulters can be called by the hostel authorities any time, so they are advised to take the report of their wards from the hostel warden from time to time.
- 14) Married girls are not allowed to stay in the college hostel.

Appointment of Local Guardian

1. Appointment of a Local Guardian is mandatory for admission to the Hostel.
2. **Parents must submit photographs of local guardians at the time of admission to the hostel.**
3. Unmarried men (real brothers and cousins) will not be accepted as local guardians and will not be allowed to enter the college premises.
4. In case of an emergency, local guardians will be informed.
5. Parents/local guardians must immediately inform in writing any change in their address or contact number.
6. **If any of the documents submitted by the students at the time of hostel admission is found to be fraudulent the student will be rusticated from the hostel.**
7. Only parents / guardians will be allowed to meet their wards from 3:30 pm to 5:30 pm on Saturdays and 10:30am to 1:00pm on Sundays.

Joining the Hostel

1. Resident students are expected to arrive a day before the term starts.
2. They are expected to bring their own bedding, bed linen and locks.
3. Furniture will be issued to the resident students against their signature. Each student will be responsible for any breakage or loss of furniture issued to her. Before leaving the hostel she must obtain a 'No Dues' certificate from the warden.
4. Hostel students are not permitted to use private electrical appliances. In case of a default a fine of Rs 500/- will be imposed and the electrical appliance will be confiscated. They are also warned not to tamper with electrical fittings. The college will not be responsible for any mishap.

5. The college does not take the responsibility of valuables (especially mobile phones) and excessive cash of resident students. They are therefore advised not to bring jewellery with them.
6. The college does not take any responsibility for any action of any girl that proves fatal or is detrimental to her social position.

Permission to Leave the Hostel

1. Students will not be allowed to leave the hostel before the official teaching is declared off. They are advised to take prior permission from the Principal if they make any travel reservation before this date.
2. If parents want to give a permanent authority to their wards to leave the hostel for tuitions, day or home town trip, they must fill the specified form at the time of admission to the hostel and sign the register.

Outings

1. **Outings will be given to resident students on Sundays and other holidays from 10:00 am to 6:00 pm and on Wednesdays from 2:00 pm to 6:00 pm.**

2. All students will report daily for Roll Call at 5:30pm sharp in winters and at 7pm in summers.
3. If a student proceeds on a 'Day-Out' she is required to report back in the hostel failing which strict disciplinary action will be taken and she may even be denied admission for the next session.
4. In case of 'night out' if a student does not report back on the due date strict disciplinary action will be taken against her.

Official Holidays

Students are allowed to go home on official holidays on the production of permission letter from the parents and after submission of leave application. In case they extend the stipulated period of stay without informing the Hostel Authorities within 24 hours a serious action will be taken against them.
